### **Report on the Financial Statements**

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of *M/S SHUBHVATIKA DEVLOPERS PVT LTD*, which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2017, the Statement of Profit and Loss, Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.
