It appears that the Dy. Sanitary Commissioner advised construction of 2 Night Soil Depots in his inspection Note of 20th + 21st July, 1915, and out of the allotment of Rs 26000/- towards grants under <sup>Govt</sup> Resolution No. 86432 of 16.11.14, the Commissioner was pleased to make a grant of Rs 762/- for construction of 2 Night Soil Depots, - which was communicated to this office by the D.C. in his Memo. No. 1409/VII-2 of 7.2.18.

The site selecting Committee consisting of the Chairman, vice-chairman and Mr. Smith, Manager, Dumbka Estate and Mr. Commissioner, selected the site near Sharamsala - upon which the Zamindar through his attorney Mr. B. D. Smith granted a registered patta settling the land with the Municipality on the express condition of constructing a Depot there on 28.8.1919.

On 2.2.1920, several rate-payers objected to the site by petition - with a note from Mr. Smith, in which he says that "at the time of settlement he had mentioned that the tenants might object to a Depot being constructed on the site". He also requested for consideration of the matter and agreed to cancel the settlement.

They also approached the D.C. for removal of the two Night-soil cart Depots near Sharamsala - and the D.C. was pleased to send it for a note by 22.3.20.

From the note of the Chairman - of 16.2.20, it appears that the people interested "were distinctly given to understand that a Depot would be constructed near Sharamsala; evidently about the time of settlement. It also appears from the Chairman's notes of 16.2.20 that the contractor was asked not to take up the work till decision of the objection.

The matter was laid before the Commissioners at a meeting held on 9.3.20. The majority of Commissioners considered

The objection as unreasonable and refused to abandoned  
the site.

Some of the Commissioners of this Municipality made a  
representation on 6<sup>th</sup> 20 to the Chairman for reconsideration  
of the question of the removal of the night soil depot  
near Dharmasala and requested to postpone the  
construction of the depot. But according to Rule 20 of  
the Business Rules. This question was not opened,

on 15.4.20. Some Marwaris made a petition  
stating that they were willing to have another night soil  
Depot constructed according to the directions of the  
Municipal authorities - and also requested to show  
them new site for night soil depot.

In reply they were ordered that they  
would settle with Mr. Smith - and get a sight selection.

on 3.5.20, a notice was issued to the Trustees of  
Dharmasala to build a Night soil Depot within  
one month from date - otherwise the one built  
by the Municipality will be used.

In reply they stated that they have selected  
the new site for night soil depot but <sup>they are</sup> unable  
to begin the work until the Municipality  
does not apply to Mr. Grant for leaving the date  
site near Dharmasala. They also requested  
to the Municipality to cancel the lease of the  
night soil depot. In reply they were informed  
that the Municipality can not surrender  
the lease until the new depot is built for it.  
(vide ltr no. 213 dt 17.8.20).

A ltr dt 11.9.20 was issued to the Trustees of  
Marwari Dharmasala informing that if they do not take any action re construction  
of new depot. Then the present depot will be used  
by the Municipality by the 1st October 1920.

But no action taken by the Trustees of Marwari  
Dharmasala upto 2.10.20.

A ltr dt 2.10.20 was ordered to finish  
the work. vide v. c.'s order dt 2.10.20.
